Enrol now and gain the skills and knowledge to become a consulting arborist or tree manager. Graduates with this qualification assess trees and produce reports and documentation attesting to the health and risks related to trees.

This program is most suited to applicants who have completed a Certificate III or higher-level qualification in a related discipline and possess a minimum of 24 months' relevant industry experience in vegetation management which has included the inspection/assessment and maintenance of trees.

Applicants must also have access to the internet and a laptop computer and be proficient in computer skills sufficient to conduct research and complete word-processed assignments, projects and reports and to enter data into an online portal.

To be selected for entry into AHC50524 Diploma of Arboriculture, applicants are required to complete a suitability review and a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) evaluation, prior to enrolment. Applicants must have achieved the following units of competency or their equivalent prior to commencing this qualification:

- AHCARB323 Identify trees
- AHCARB314 Implement a tree maintenance program
- · AHCARB316 Perform pruning operations

Training, RPL and assessment only pathways for these units of competency are available for eligible students.


